| <i>The Caddis and the Angler</i> | Solomon, Larry & Leiser, Eric | Entomology | A guide to fishing important caddis families, with step-by-step, illustrated tying for each stage. |
| <i>Fishing the Dry Fly as a Living Insect</i> | Wright, Leonard M. Jr. | Fishing | Wright challenges the dead-drift tradition with keen observation and experiments imparting movement to the fly. |
| <i>Fly-Fishing Guide to the Upper Delaware River</i> | Weamer, Paul | Fishing | Detailed guide giving exact locations, hatch information, and choices for flies. |
| <i>Hatches & Hatches II</i> | Caucci, Al & Nastasi, Bob | Fishing | Al is a big fan of the Catskills, and his contribution is Catskills oriented. Caucci and Nastasi introduced creative ways of tying flies; e.g., the Comparadun--a Catskill favorite. |
| <i>Hewitt's Nymph Fly Fishing</i> | Hewitt, Edward R. | Fishing | A thin paperback dedicated to Hewitt's nymphing efforts. |
| <i>How to Take Trout on Wet Flies and Nymphs</i> | Ovington, Ray | Fishing | Fishing strategies with a Catskill influence. |
| <i>Practical Dry-Fly Fishing</i> | Gill, Emlyn M. | Fishing | Published in 1912. Possibly the most complete approach to the dry fly at that time. Gill's thoughts are still relevant. |
| <i>Speckled Trout</i> | Burroughs, John | Fishing | John Burroughs has long been recognized as a Catskill naturalist; his eassays date back to the1800's. |
| <i>Streamcraft: An Angling Manual</i> | Parker, George | Fishing | Angling strategies dating back to the 1920's, by a noted angler of the time. |
| <i>Taking Larger Trout</i> | Koller, Lawrence R. | Fishing | Angling strategies from a noted Neversink angler. |
| <i>Telling on the Trout</i> | Hewitt, Edward R. | Fishing | Hewitt, a Catskill legend! |

| <i>Fur, Feathers & Steel</i> | Cross, Reuben R. | Fly Tying | Many hold that Rube Cross is the originator of the Catskill School of fly tying, expanding upon the ideas and creations of Gordon and refining the standard of the upright divided-wing dry fly. |
| <i>The Book of Fly Patterns</i> | Leiser, Eric | Fly Tying | Over 1,000 patterns |
| <i>The Complete Fly Tier</i> | Cross, Reuben R. | Fly Tying | A Freshet Press reprint that includes two books by Rube Cross: <i>Tying American Trout Lures</i> (1936) & <i>Fur, Feathers, and Steel</i> (1940). |
| <i>The Founding Flies</i> | Valla, Mike | Fly Tying | Each chapter is beautifully written and photographed, promoting an appreciation of not only the famous flies but also bringing to life the people who created them. |
